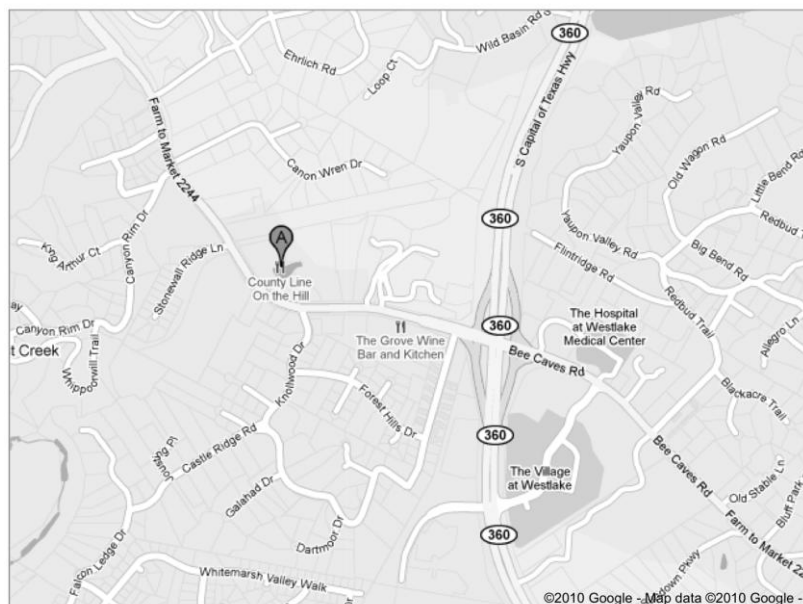
Our vision, mission, and core values continue as the foundation of the plan. The six strategic goals remain unchanged as they relate to our efforts to
